Narrative Writing

What is narrative writing?

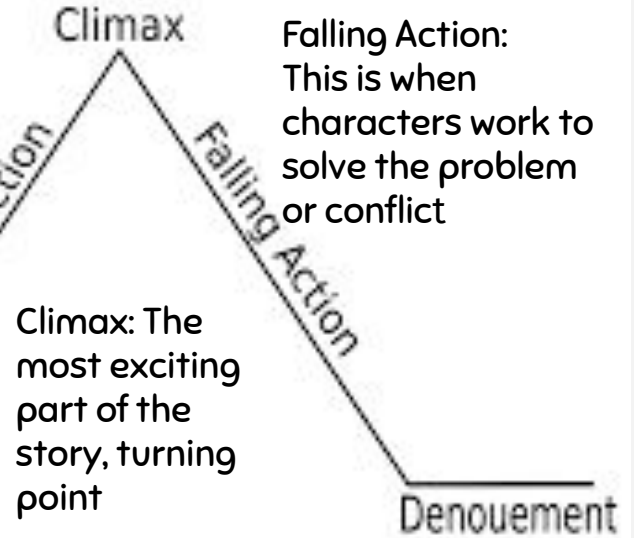
Writing that is characterized by a main character in a setting who engages with a problem or event in a significant way.



Story Mapping

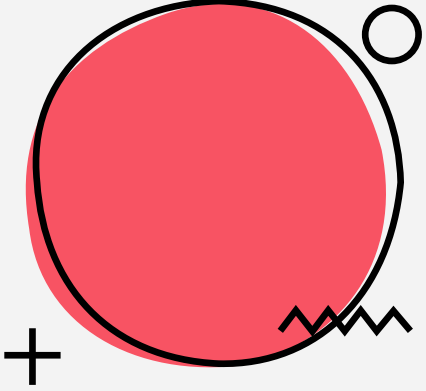
Rising Action:
This includes the events leading up to the main problem or conflict.

Exposition:
This is where you introduce the background information about events, settings, characters, or other elements of a work to the readers.



Resolution:
This is how things end up in the story (the ending).

Beginning:

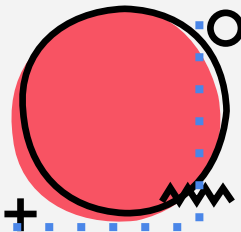
- ❖ Characters

Introduction

The job of an introduction in an essay is to grab the reader's attention and then let the reader know what the essay will be about. Your introduction is to keep the reader interested in your story and wanting to read more.

Different ways to start an essay:

- Anecdote: a short personal story to help give an example of the topic
- Quotation: quoting another person or book that helps support or explain the writer's argument
- Statistics: facts or data to support writer's claim
- Rhetorical question: a question without an answer. The purpose is to ask a question in order to get the reader to think about the topic
- Background Information: very brief but important information in the introduction

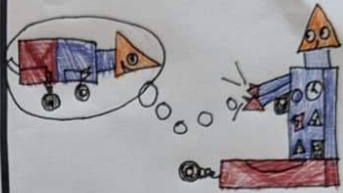

Story Examples

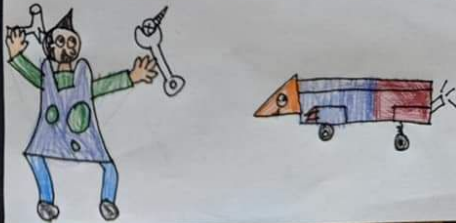
① Boy and Robot were playing.

③ Boy fixed Robot and Robot turned into a bike.



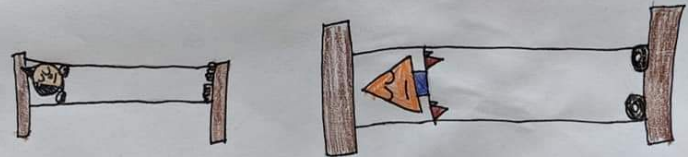
④ Boy put oil in Robot bike.
